The National Professional Science Master's Association (NPSMA) Board of Directors held its Annual Meeting on Wednesday, November 4 in Washington, DC.

During the meeting, the Board announced the four new Directors elected by the general membership to begin serving a three-year term. Those chosen were: Cynthia Bainton of Northeastern University, Daniel Chatham of the Keck Graduate Institute for Applied Life Sciences, John Nishio of California State University, Chico and Joseph Whittaker of Morgan State University. All nominees who sought election were thanked for their willingness to increase their involvement in the NPSMA.

After the meeting, the newly formed Board met to elect its officers for 2010. The executive committee for next year will be President Elizabeth Friedman of the Illinois Institute of Technology, Vice President Dagmar Beck of Rice University, Convener Cynthia Bainton, and Finance Officer Daniel Chatham. Outgoing officers Ursula Bechert (President), Loida Escote-Carlson (Convener), and Kirk Jordan (Finance Officer) were acknowledged for their dedication, leadership, and service.

This has been a tremendous year of growth for the PSM degree. We have seen significant increases in the numbers of enrolled students and alumni, programs and the universities that offer them, state and system wide development initiatives, and government agencies, like the National Science Foundation, creating new funding programs to support their growth.

The NPSMA has been evolving to keep in step with these changes. We held workshops in Tucson AZ, Nashville TN, and Springfield MA to promote best practices and foster networking among PSM professionals. NPSMA to roll out Annual PSM Degree Program Enrollment and Graduate Study in December

This month, the NPSMA will conduct its *Annual PSM Degree Program Enrollment and Graduate Survey* by surveying all PSM degree program directors. The online questionnaire is divided into four sections: 1) program contact information, 2) profile of currently enrolled students, 3) summary of all-time graduates, and 4) program design.

The information will be shared with PSM degree program directors, PSM degree program advocates (Council of Graduate Schools, for example), the media, and policymakers. The data will provide an updated count and profile of PSM degree program students and alumni as well as monitor any shifts in PSM degree program management and design.

PSM degree program directors will receive an email from the NPSMA in the coming weeks directing them to a survey portal where they may log on and enter their data. It is not expected that it will take more than 20-30 minutes to complete the survey for the larger programs nor 10-20 minutes for the smaller (or newer) programs.

Last winter, we were able to achieve a 95% response rate! We published a copy of the findings this past spring. A copy of this year's report is available at the following link: http://www.npsma.org/assetlibrary/eg_data_report_final.pdf.

The New NPSMA Alumni Connection: Q&A with Alumni Coordinator Deb Warren-Hite

NPSMA: What has been available to PSM alumni to this point?

Deb: We have been in the process of building a database of the roughly 2500 PSM alumni and asking them about what NPSMA services are most important to them. We currently offer an alumni LinkedIn page and have held socials, webinars, and teleconferences.

NPSMA: What would you like PSM graduates to contribute to or participate in?

Deb: Obviously, we would like them to become members in the NPSMA and to help shape the direction of the association since it is *their* professional association. We'd really like to hear their stories, too. Testimonials are fine, but we'd like more detail about why they chose their career, the type of work they are doing, how the PSM degree has helped them advance, and the type of advice that they'd like to offer to PSM students that are following in their footsteps.

NPSMA: What can we expect from the Alumni Connection in 2010?

Deb: We will significantly increase our outreach efforts to identify our graduates and to track their career paths. For example we will conduct another Alumni/Employment survey, develop an internship and job posting board, and offer professional development, networking, and mentoring opportunities.

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
